Madaba, Mt. Nebo, Dead Sea - Overnight Petra



Enjoy an early morning stroll through the market town of Madaba, as this fascinating little Christian community comes to life. Visit the oldest map of the Holy Land on the floor of Saint George's Church. Madaba is home to hundreds of mosaics in both public and private buildings. Then visit Mt. Nebo, the alleged burial site of Moses overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. From this mountain, Moses first glimpsed the Holy Land, a land he was never allowed to enter. Here Franciscans have built a structure that protects a Byzantine church. You will then drive through the biblical landscape to the Dead Sea for a swim in the salty, mineral-rich waters of this lowest spot on Earth. Experience the ultimate sensation of trying to swim, while only floating. After a refreshing float transfer to Petra for overnight.

Full-day in Petra - Overnight Petra

Once the ancient Nabatean capital, Petra gently reveals itself as you walk through the Siq, an immense crack in the sandstone mountains. This winding, one-kilometer-long fissure between overhanging cliffs twists and turns until it finally and with great style, makes one last turn, and out of the gloom in towering brightness appears Petra's most impressive monument, el Khazneh - The Treasury. This is one of the most elegant remains of antiquity anywhere in the world and is carved out of solid rock.

Beyond el Khazneh the visitor is surrounded on both sides by hundreds of carved and built structures, soaring temples, elaborate royal tombs, a carved Roman theater, large and small houses and burial chambers. A Victorian traveler and poet gave Petra a description that holds to this day - **"Match me such a marvel save in Eastern clime, a rose-red city half as old as time."**

Free morning in Petra. Wadi Rum for Overnight

After a free morning in Petra, it's time to transfer to the magical desert of Wadi Rum, home of "Lawrence of Arabia". A jeep driven by a local Bedouin will tour you through the ochre-colored, moon-like landscaped desert as you visit the sites of Rum. These include Lawrence's Spring named after T.E. Lawrence, of Lawrence of Arabia fame, who fought in the Arab revolt against the Ottoman Empire, and Khazali Canyon an iconic feature in Wadi Rum. The Canyon is an easy 20-minute walk with Nabatean inscriptions and drawings.

Following your tour of Rum you will head directly to the Discovery Bedu Eco-friendly luxury camp with its unsurpassed sunset views. Uniquely tailored to perfectly blend with the natural surroundings, the camp offers you an authentic experience in the heart of this truly spectacular place without compromising on your comfort. Located at a particularly scenic viewpoint in Wadi Rum, the bespoke camp is run by local Bedouin and was the inspiration behind many of the newer camps in Rum. Its 8 en-suite tented suites have hot and cold running water and solar-powered electricity. The central tent is handmade by the Bedouin from goat hair and is used as the main dining area and for evening gatherings. Enjoy an evening around the campfire in the Star Lounge on one of the luxury sofas enjoying the desert night sky, looking out for constellations, shooting stars, and the Milky Way. Wake up in the serenity of the desert and enjoy breakfast on the rocks with undisturbed views of Wadi Rum stretching for hundreds of miles.
