Arrival in Jordan — Meet & Assist-Transfer to Dead Sea for overnight

On arrival at Amman our airport team will meet and assist, guide through customs, organise the visa. After this you will be transferred to your hotel.

Dead Sea, Madaba, Mt. Nebo and overnight Dead Sea

Experience the ultimate sensation of trying to swim, while only floating in the super salty waters of the lowest place on earth. Afternoon visit to Madaba and Mt Nebo. Visit the oldest map of the Holy Land on the floor of Saint George's Church. Madaba is full of mosaics which can be found in private houses as well as many churches. After Madaba, a short drive will bring you to Mt. Nebo, the alleged burial site of Moses overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea. From this mountain, Moses first glimpsed the Promised Land, a land he was never allowed to enter. Here Franciscans have built a structure that protects a 4th and 6th Century Byzantine church. After lunch at one of the fantastic restaurants in Madaba, return to the Dead Sea for a restful float in the super salty waters of the Dead Sea.

Jerash, Amman city tour and overnight at the Dead Sea

After breakfast, you will visit one of the best-preserved examples of Roman civilization, the city of Jerash. Jerash, part of the Decapolis (the ten big Roman cities of the East) has been called the Pompeii of the East for its unique state of preservation. The city features theaters, churches, temples (Zeus and Artemis), Nymphaeum, and colonnaded streets. Then head back to Amman for an under-the-skin tour of the capital of the Hashemite Kingdom. Amman offers a contrast between oriental and cosmopolitan. The tour will take you to the museums, the Citadel, the amphitheater, the souks, and the modern part of town. It will include a tour of the best street food on offer in Jordan before you head back to the Dead Sea for overnight.

Visit Petra then Dead Sea for overnight

Depart the Dead Sea on a full-day tour of Petra. Once the ancient Nabatean capital, this city gently reveals itself as you walk through its hand-carved facades. Walk through the SIQ, an immense crack in the sandstone. It is a winding, one-kilometer-long fissure between overhanging cliffs that seem to meet more than 300 feet overhead. Near the end of the passage, the SIQ, with great style, makes one last turn, and out of the gloom in towering brightness appears Petra's most impressive monument, el Khazneh - The Treasury. This is one of the most elegant remains of antiquity anywhere in the world and is carved out of solid rock.

Beyond el Khazneh the visitor is surrounded on both sides by hundreds of Petra's carved and built structures, soaring temples, elaborate royal tombs, a carved Roman theater, large and small houses, and burial chambers. The Victorian traveler and poet, Dean Burgon, gave Petra a description that holds to this day - **"Match me such a marvel save in Eastern clime, a rose-red city half as old as time."** Back to the Dead Sea for overnight.
